PASTOR'S CORNER

This past week, 67 youth and adults of our parish served the poor of West Virginia by helping provide emergency repairs to homes of local residents in Mingo, Summers and Wyoming counties in what is called the Appalachia Service Project (ASP). It is an organization which facilitates service work offered by volunteers from church groups, schools and others who desire to put their faith into action, to make a difference in the lives of people in need. Our parish participants went with skills they had honed from training and practice over the last several months to prepare for the jobs they would tackle. In addition, there were many hours of fundraising to help raise the money needed to cover the expenses of this week of service.

Our parish ASP group exemplified Christ's love and compassion for those in need. It was an organized, group effort that typifies what many of us might do on an individual basis in rather quiet and unassuming ways. Still, ASP reinforces for the young people and adults who participate the true meaning of "love thy neighbor," and allows this week-long experience to be a powerful memory, a reminder of the poor in our midst and Jesus' call to serve them. ASP also allows our wider parish community members to be involved vicariously as these 67 parishioners represented Holy Family Parish in their caring outreach to the needy in West Virginia. Just think of the many prayers offered by our parish for ASP, for their good work and for the people they served. Additionally, the financial support offered by our many parishioners helped make it possible for the ASP volunteers to take part in this trip. The Father's Day weekend "Wash & Worship" car wash alone made \$2237 towards expenses - a tribute to the generosity of our parishioners!

As we welcome our parish ASP volunteers back from their service trip this weekend, we thank God for the example of goodness and generosity offered by the participants and by all in our parish and beyond who helped make this outreach possible. May it spur us on to make service to our neighbors in need an ever more conscious response here at home, making present the "preferential option for the poor" Jesus made his priority.
